The Prospect Hill Foundation is a private foundation established in New York in 1960 by Elizabeth G. Beinecke and William S. Beinecke, then president and now the retired chairman of the Sperry and Hutchinson Company. In 1983, the Prospect Hill Foundation merged with the Frederick W. Beinecke Fund, which had been established by the will of William S. Beinecke's father and was later augmented by the will of Carrie Sperry Beinecke, his mother.

The Foundation's grants primarily support activities in the United States. While many of these activities are national in scope, there is particular regional focus in New York, New Jersey, Rhode Island and Massachusetts. Limited support is directed towards environmental conservation and reproductive health projects in northern Guatemala and southern Mexico.

THE MISSION OF THE PROSPECT HILL FOUNDATION IS TO ADVANCE THE HUMAN EXPERIENCE WHILE ENSURING THE WELL-BEING OF THE EARTH.

The Prospect Hill Foundation pursues this mission by making grants in four program areas, each of which has stated goals.

ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION

- to support conservation strategies that protect natural systems
- to improve air quality for the benefit of human and ecological health

NUCLEAR NONPROLIFERATION

- to limit the spread of nuclear weapons by providing reliable information to U.S. policy makers, the media, and the public

REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH AND RIGHTS

- to support the right of women and men to be informed of and have access to safe, effective, affordable and acceptable methods of fertility regulation of their choice

CRIMINAL JUSTICE

- to promote a fair and humane criminal justice system

In addition, the Foundation makes a number of Core Grants that support the general philanthropic interests and goals of Prospect Hill Foundation directors and their family.

From July 1, 2006-June 30, 2007, grants totaling \$3.6 million were awarded to 98 organizations for 110 activities. In addition, a matching contributions program awarded \$280,000 to 178 organizations. As of June 30, 2007, the endowment market value of The Prospect Hill Foundation was \$75 million.

Unsolicited requests for support are not normally considered. Invited applicants may submit proposals to:

The proposal narrative should be no more than six pages and include:

- organization background and history
- proposed grant activities, including timeframe
- a description of how success will be measured

Proposals should also include the following as attachments:

- a budget for proposed grant activities for all years covered in the proposal
- a budget for the organization for all years covered in the proposal
- a list of major corporate and foundation donors
- the organization's most recent audited financial statements
- biographies of key staff members
- a list of the organization's board of directors
- the organization's 501(c)(3) IRS determination letter
